3.2 - How to Write Learning Objectives Using Bloom's Taxonomy

With Bloom's Taxonomy, there are six levels of skills ranked in order from the most basic to the most complex. Each level of skill is associated with a verb, as learning is an action. As a teacher, you should ensure that the questions you ask both in class and on written assignments and tests are pulled from all levels of the taxonomy pyramid.

Domains of Bloom's Taxonomy Benjamin Samuel Bloom (1913 - 1999) was an American educational psychologist who made contributions to the classification of educational objectives and to the theory of mastery learning. The taxonomy was first presented in 1956 through the publication "The Taxonomy of Educational Objectives, The Classification of Educational Goals, Handbook I: Cognitive Domain" (Bloom 1956).

Any time you make reference to Bloom's Taxonomy specifically or to something found within the book, whether paraphrasing or directly quoting, you must indicate the reference in your paper. In APA format, in-text uses author-date format.

Writing Objectives Using Bloom's Taxonomy

There are six levels of thinking, according to Benjamin Bloom, who developed the concept of higher order thinking levels in 1956. Those levels (lowest to highest) are Knowledge, Comprehension, Application, Analysis, Synthesis, and Evaluation. Each level of thinking should be considered when creating the learning objectives or outcomes of a course.
